

## Margaret Peppenbrink Deed

The deed below relates to the widow of the immigrant Peter Peppenbrink (the father of Christian Petenbrink. In regard to this document, on July 11, 2006 Andy Petenbrink wrote "The attached file contains the Margaret Pepenbrink Deed dated August 16 1873. The deed indicates that she was the widow of the later Peter Pepenbrink. The Justice of the Peace certification aslso states that Margaret Pepenbrink appeared in person on the sixteenth day of August. Thus providing objective evidence that Peter was dead and that she was living on that date." L. Dietle July 11, 2006

At the request of Bridget McCarly this  
Deed was Recorded Aug 16 1873.

This Deed made this sixteenth day of August Eighteen hundred  
and seventy three by Margaret Peppenbrink (widow of the late Peter  
Peppenbrink) of the City of Cumberland, Allegany County, Maryland  
to Bridget McCarly (wife of Michael McCarly) also of said  
City of Cumberland; She the said Margaret Peppenbrink, in consideration  
of the sum of one thousand dollars to her this day paid, herly grants  
bargains and sells unto the said Bridget McCarly, all her right  
title, interest, claim, demands, and other interest, of, in and to  
or arising from, all that part of lot number sixty two (62)  
in LeBarth's Addition to the City of Cumberland, in Howard Street  
which was conveyed by the said Michael McCarly to said  
Bridget McCarly by and bearing date upon the 26<sup>th</sup> day of  
February Eighteen hundred and sixty nine and recorded in Liber  
No. 10, Number 28 folio 565, one of the said Records of said Alleg-  
any County, in testimony whereof, Witness the following signatures  
and seal

sharply & truly that on this sixteenth  
day of August 1873, before the subscriber a Justice of the Peace of  
the State of Maryland in and for Allegany County personally appeared  
Margaret Peppenbrink, and acknowledged the foregoing deed to be  
her act.
