In regard to the images, Robin wrote “A *small (4x5-1/4") 3-volume set of Shakespeare came to me from Grandmother Yeamans, born Mildred Korns. She signed her name in only in "As You Like It" (1902). The other two volumes are "The Merchant of Venice" (1903) and "Twelfth Night" (1913). The signature is dated April 6, 1903. Grandma said she wrote "backhand," which refers to the slant of her handwriting.*”.
