Henry Korns Cannon

During the 1831 session of the Maryland General Assembly, Resolution No. 42 required the Governor and Council to deliver a 6 pound iron cannon, together with carriage, limbers and accourtements to Henry Korns and Noses H. Lauthan of Cumberland, Allegany County, Maryland. Based on a cast iron weight of 0.282 to 0.285 pounds per cubic inch, a true six pound cannon ball would measure from 3.438 to 3.426 inches in diameter.

The book "The Genealogy of Michael Korns, Sr..." states "He was called "Captain Henry Korns, 2nd" by his grand-daughter. His commission made him a captain in the State Militia of Allegheny County, Maryland, February 22, 1826."

Passed Feb. 13,1832 Resolution in favor of the heirs of George Ireland, deceased.

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That so much of the resolution in favour of the heirs of George Ireland, a revolutionary soldier, passed at December session, eighteen hundred and twenty-eight, number fifty-five, as requires the land granted by said resolution to be located to the west of Fort Cumberland, be, and the same is hereby repealed.

Passed Feb 20,1832 Resolution in favor of Henry Korns, and Moses H. Lauthan.

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the executive deliver to Henry Korns and Moses H. Lauthan, of the Town of Cumberland, in Allegany county or to their order, one piece of six pound iron ordnance, with carriage, limbers, and the accourtements belonging thereto, upon their giving bond approved by the governor and council conditioned for the safe keeping, and return of the same to the city of Annapolis, when required by the executive.

Passed Feb.21,1832 Resolution requiring the Armorer to deliver to Captain Charles R. Stewart, certain Rifles, &c.

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the armorer, at Annapolis, be, and he is hereby required to deliver to Captain Charles R. Stewart, of Anne Arundel county, a number not exceeding sixty rifles, with appropriate accourrements which the said armorer may select, on his giving security for the safe keeping, and return of the same as the governor and council may require.
