

Genealogy of the Relatives of

WILLIAM J. MILLER

Son of Daniel Miller and Mary Jane French. Born near Ft. Madison, Lea County, Iowa, April 23, 1843 A.D.

Wm. J. Miller, Hamilton, Nebraska, March 13, 1899

I am about to write down the family records of my relations. It is the fourth of July, in the year of our Lord, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-four. I am at the home of my uncle Jacob D. Miller; it is the home of his father, where my father and most of his brothers and sisters were born and many of them lived and died. The name of my father's father is David Miller, and the name of my father's mother is Fraine Livengood. Here they lived and died. There is an old book before me in which my grandfather Miller had written the record of his own family; also the record of his father's family, and the record of his wife's father's family.

GREAT GRANDFATHER MILLER AND GREAT AUNT ELIZABETH GAVER

I will first give the record of my great grandfather Peter Miller. Peter Miller was born in Germany in the parish of Altenkirk Helmeroth, September 11, 1739. He came to America September 25, 1749. He was married to Elizabeth Gaver July 10, 1760 in Frederick Co., Maryland. Then comes the names and the time of birth of their children. The place of birth is not given, nor is there any mention of their marriages or deaths. The following list contains their names and dates of birth:

On the twenty-first of July I resume my work on the records. I have gained more information of my relatives during the time from my uncle Jacob and also from my second cousin Daniel L. Miller of Bruceton Mills, Preston Co., West Virginia.

Great, Great Grandfather Miller

From them I have the tradition that my great, great grandfather Miller was a soldier at the time he left Europe, and that he was a deserter. Uncle Jacob says he had a furlough to go home and see his father who was sick at the time and that he was on the ocean before the officers knew it. Cousin Daniel says he had a brother who deserted with him and that they were pursued and fired upon. They ran into a corn field and he made good his escape. The fate of his brother was not known for he never heard of him any more. Uncle Jacob says he never knew there was a brother and thinks if there had been his father would have mentioned it.

Great, Great Grandfather Miller

The tradition is told, and it is no doubt correct, that my great, great, great grandfather lived to the age of 110 years. He died and was buried in West Phalia, Germany. None of the Millers have attained as great an age since but some have completed more than their allotted time of three score and ten years. There is no mention yet made to me of the

children of my great, great grandfather Miller except that I have already written. Neither has there been any mention of his wife.

Great, Great Grandfather Miller

After my great, great grandfather Miller came to America he lived a while in New Jersey and then moved to Frederick Co., Maryland. He lived to a good old age. I have not heard his christian name nor the name of his wife. Neither have I heard of any of his children but my great grandfather Peter Miller. I should have mentioned that my great, great grandfather Miller died in Frederick Co., Maryland.

Great Grandfather Peter Miller and Great Grand Aunt Elizabeth Gaver

In the record written by my grandfather which I have already given, it would appear that my great grandfather Peter Miller had been married only once. But, I have learned that he was married three times. His first wife Elizabeth Gaver is the one mentioned by my grandfather. She brought him four children, David, John, Rebecca and Abigail. Now Elizabeth must have died soon after the birth of Abigail, and the birth of Elizabeth, the first born of Rebecca, was only 14 months and 17 days.

Great Grandmother Rebecca Gaver

His second wife, Rebecca Gaver, was a sister to the first. She brought him four children, Elizabeth, Mary, Jonathan and David. From the fact that a second child was named David, I infer that the first had died. As in the death of his first wife so it was in the death of the second. He was soon married again and a child was born to him in just two years from the birth of David. There was still another of the Gaver sisters single which some of the people thought he ought to take for his third wife.

Great Grand Stepmother Ruddock

But he chose for his third wife a Miss Ruddock by whom he had the remaining eight children. It appears that each of his wives were misses. The last one was indeed a stepmother.

It is now the first of August in the year of our Lord 1874. And, I shall again copy from the old book of my grandfather the record of his wife's father's family.

Great Grandfather Peter Livengood and Great Grandmother Barbara Nafzinger

Peter Livengood was born in Switzerland, in Europe, and emigrated to America in 1749. He died in Somerset Co., Pa. in the year 1826 on the 27th of April at the age of 96 years. Barbara, his beloved wife, also from Europe, intermarried in America and begat the following number of heirs and died in a good old age of 72 years:

Grand aunt Christina Fike, born March 2, 1763.

Grand aunt Barbara Yoder, born August 14, 1764.

Grand uncle Peter Livengood, born December 16, 1765.

Grand aunt Mary Saylor, born September 18, 1767; died March 22, 1848.

Grand aunt Analis Ruble, born June 21, 1769; died September, 1847.

Grand uncle Semm (a son), born February 28, 1771; died 1773.

Grand aunt Catharine Ogg, born August 8, 1773.

Grand aunt Elizabeth Breneiser, born July 8, 1775.

Grand uncle Sem (a son), born September 16, 1777; died 1779.

Grand uncle John Livengood, born March 14, 1779; died February 21, 1839.

Grandmother Fraina Miller, born November 13, 1780.

The above is all that is written of the Livengood family. I have not yet received information enough from other sources to continue the history further but trust I may at some future date.

Great Grandfather Peter Miller

I find in the same old book of my grandfather Miller the record of his own family. On the head of the page is a line, separated from the rest, which gives the death of my great grandfather Peter Miller. Peter Miller, senior, died January 13, 1829.

His Sister

This is all I can give of him at present, but will say in this connection that uncle Jacob had told me that he (Peter Miller) had a sister who moved away from the rest of her folks in an early day and settled on some river. But, as no names or dates were given I cannot but mention the fact.

Grandfather Miller and Wife

I will now give the record of grandfather Miller's family as he wrote it in his book. But, I first should mention that some additions have been made by others since his death. David Miller was born December 18, 1775. Fraina Livengood was born November 13, 1780. They were married January 5, 1802. The following are their children:

Aunt Elizabeth, born October 26, 1826.

Grandfather David Miller, the father of the above children, died at half past twelve o'clock on Monday, July 14, 1856. Grandmother Fraina Livengood Miller died at half past nine o'clock on the morning of January 8, 1861. Aunt Mary Miller died in the evening at five minutes to 8 o'clock.

I have copied all that is in the old book referred to except the records of some of uncle Jacob's and aunt Elizabeth's families and I can get them in full elsewhere.

Uncle Samuel Miller

In a record kept by uncle Peter Miller the death of uncle Samuel Miller was in 1836 instead of 1837 as it is in the old book of my grandfather. I will try to harmonize this at a future time. I will next copy from my own memorandum book such information as I have been able to collect while visiting my relatives since I arrived here from Oregon.

John C. Kendall and Aunt Elizabeth Miller

On July 1, 1874 I received the following record of aunt Elizabeth: John C. Kendall was born in Southampton Twp., Somerset Co., Pa. on June 5, 1817; died January 30, 1888. Elizabeth Miller was born in Greenville Twp., Somerset Co., Pa. on October 26, 1826; died October 30, 1905. They were married December 12, 1850. The following are their children:

Cousin John C., born September 4, 1851.

Cousin Rachal Rebecca, born April 16, 1853.

Cousin Abigail Elizabeth Emily, born February 8, 1855.

Cousin David Peter, born October 24, 1857; died May 1, 1876.

I do not remember asking the question, but I think aunt Elizabeth was married and all her children born in Greenville Twp., Somerset Co., Pa.

Mathias Bowman and Aunt Anna Miller

On July 2, 1874 I received the following from aunt Anna: Mathias Bowman was born in 1826. Anna Miller was born on August 18, 1819. They were married in Somerset Co., Pa., April 7, 1853 by William Conrad. Their children are:

Daniel Custer and Aunt Saloma Miller

On July 7, 1874, I received the following from aunt Saloma: Daniel Custer was born in Elk Lick Twp., Somerset Co., Pa. on May, 1800. Saloma Miller was born in Greenville Twp., Somerset Co., Pa. on May 21, 1810. They were married September 19, 1831 at the home of her parents in Greenville Twp., Somerset Co., Pa. Their children are:

Cousin Elizabeth, born in District No. 3, Allegany Co., Md. on August 19, 1832.

Cousin Rachael, born in District No. 3, Allegany Co., Md. on October 9, 1833; died in Greenville Twp., Somerset Co., Pa. on April 21, 1852.

Aunt Anna and Elizabeth

Today is August 15, 1874 and I will continue the record. I have learned that both of my aunts Anna and Elizabeth Miller were married and all their children born in Greenville Twp., Somerset Co., Pa.

Solomon Baker and Cousin Elizabeth Custer

On July 7, 1874 I received this from my cousin Elizabeth Baker: Solomon Baker was born in Southampton Twp., Somerset Co., Pa. on August 22, 1820. Elizabeth Custer was born in District No. 3, Allegany Co., Md. on August 19, 1832. They were married in Greenville Twp., Somerset Co., Pa. on September 19, 1850. Their children are:

2nd cousin Daniel, born April 28, 1851.

2nd cousin Samuel, born May 6, 1853.

2nd cousin John Wesley, born July 13, 1855.

Grand Aunt Elizabeth Miller and John Lichty

On the same day I received this from my fourth cousin Mahlon P. Lichty: My grand aunt Elizabeth Miller was married to John Lichty. They had a son named Peter who was married to Sarah Peck. And, these were the parents of Mahlon P. Lichty.

Andrey Easter and Cousin Catharine Beeghley

Andrey Easter was born in Byer, Germany on January 24, 1825. Catharine Beeghley was born in Allegany Co., Md. on March 9, 1839. They were married in the Cove, Allegany Co., Md., by Sam. Krebs on September 13, 1868.

Cousin Freina Beeghley

On July 9th I received this from cousin David Beeghley: Freina Beeghley was born on August 7, 1847.

On the 11th, cousin David gave me the record of his own family. David Beeghley was born in Allegany Co., Md. on August 14, 1844. Amanda Bromhall was born in Preston Co., W.Va. on October 16, 1853. They were married by Jacob M. Thomas in Preston Co., W.Va. on May 16, 1869. Their children are:

They were both born in Preston Co., W.Va.

Michael Beeghley and Aunt Barbara Miller

This I received from Michael Beeghley: Michael Beeghley was born

near Berlin in Somerset Co., Pa. on June 18, 1800. He married my aunt Barbara Miller in the fall of the year 1823. Their children are:

Aunt Barbara Beeghley (Miller)

Barbara Beeghley died January 18, 1869. (November 12, 1903, Andrey Easter has it January 13, 1869, which is correct. W.J.M.) Now uncle Michael Beeghley is old and childish and so hard of hearing that one can hardly converse with him. And, as he gave all from memory there may be some mistakes. I think some of his children have told me that he has not given their names in the order of their ages. Also, the death of aunt Barbara is recorded on the 13th of January by uncle Peter Miller, but aunt Catharine is of the opinion that uncle Michael is right. (November 12, 1903, in Catharine Easter's Bible, January 13, 1869, right).

James B. Guthrie and Cousin Susannah Beeghley

On July 13 I received this from cousin Susannah Guthrie: James B. Guthrie was born in Grant Twp., Preston Co., W.Va. on December 27, 1826. Susannah Beeghley was born at Meyers' Mill, Somerset Co., Pa. on October 16, 1829. They were married in Grant Twp., Preston Co., W.Va. on December 17, 1847 by Rev. Jacob M. Thomas. Their children are:

2nd Cousins Daniel L., Lydia and William D. Miller

It is August 21, 1874. On the 13th of July I received from Daniel L. Miller the following in addition to what is recorded on page 103 of this record. He also gave me the date of the birth of Rebecca Gaver as given on page 105. Daniel L. Miller, son of Jonathan Miller and grandson of Peter Miller and Rebecca Gaver, was born in Elk Lick Twp., Somerset Co., Pa. on November 18, 1814. His younger sister, Lydia Miller, was born in the same township on September 7, 1816; died at home October 5, 1849. His younger brother William L. Miller was born in the same township on November 13, 1819.

Grand Uncle Jonathan Miller and Wife

Jonathan Miller died in Elk Lick Twp., Somerset Co., Pa. on April 5, 1850, and his wife on June 17, 1849. They both died on the old homestead.

Great Grandfather Peter Miller

Daniel L. Miller had a scrap of a leaf containing the birth of both of his grandparents, Peter Miller and Rebecca Gaver, but it was torn across the name of the month in the date of Peter's birth so it was hard to read and left us in doubt. Daniel thought it was December but in grandfather David Miller's book it was written plain September. The day of the month and the year are the same in both.

Cousin Daniel Beeghley and Sarah Jane Letts

On July 15 I received this from cousin Sarah Jane Beeghley. Daniel Beeghley was born at Meyers' Mill, Scmerset Co., Pa. on June 14, 1826. Sarah Jane Letts was born at Witheville, Withe Co., Va. on May 25, 1831. They were married at Witheville, Withe Co., Va. on December 24, 1858. Their children were all born in Garrett Co., Md.

The Original Manuscript

Some of the records may not be altogether correct. For instance, Grandfather Toothaker's principal residence was Castine to which I have referred the birth of all the children, but he also lived at Bangor, Old Town, and other adjoining villages in which some of them may have been born."

Where the horizontal line (______) appears, something is known but not sufficient to record. Where the space is vacant, nothing is known of the event. I have pursued this only as far as my own generation; but it will be continued still farther by William.

To the memory of the Past,

Mrs. Mary Jane Miller by Wm. J. Miller

It is now Oct. 3, 1874, and I will now give the record of my father's family up to the present date, partly from memory and partly from documents.

Father Daniel Miller

Daniel Miller, son of David Miller and Freina Livengood, was born in Greenville Twp., Somerset Co., Pa., Dec. 28, A.D. 1809. He lived with his parents most of the time until he was of age, although a part of the time he was away in Maryland and Virginia.

When he became of age he went south and west, spending much of the time traveling in the states bordering on the Ohio and Mississippi Rivers. He also became a resident of Texas before it was annexed to the U.S.

In the summer of 1840 he was keeping store in Galena, Illinois, and while returning from St. Louis where he had been purchasing merchandise, he made the acquaintenance of the family of Jacob French who were then leaving their old home in Ohio for a new home in Iowa. Jacob French and his family left the boat at Ft. Madison and bought a farm within a mile of the town.

Father was a visitor at their house before the death of Mr. French and his son, Alfred, but they died before father and mother were married. Mr. French thought a great deal of my father and was willing for him to have Mary Jane.

Mary Jane French, daughter of Jacob and Ruth Toothaker was born within a mile of the town of Belfast, Waldo Co., Me., Dec. 13, 1813. She moved with her parents to Ohio in the summer of 1818. They bought a farm in Muskingum Co., near the corner of Morgan and Gurnsey Counties. She lived with them there until they moved to Iowa in 1840.

Father

Daniel Miller and Mary Jane French were married in Ft. Madison, Lea Co., Iowa, Oct. 1, 1840. They bought a farm three miles from Ft. Madison, on the West Point road, where they lived until the 1st of July, 1856, when they sold it and moved to Albany, Linn Co., Oregon and bought a farm six and a half miles south of the town.

The lived on this farm until the death of my mother and then father lived there until the farm and property was sold. The farm was sold Aug. 28, and the personal property on Sept. 12, 1874. Father is now on the way here.

Mother

Mary Jane French, wife of Daniel Miller, died at Tangent, Linn Co., Oregon Oct. 29, 1873, at 1 o'clock in the morning. She is buried in the grave yard on Muddy Creek, about two miles from the Willamette River and four miles west of Tangent. My sister and brothers are buried in the same place all side by side and each have marble tomb stones with full inscriptions.

Children of Mr. and Mrs. Daniel Miller

On the 23rd of Sept. 1874, I received this from James Livengood, a grandson of by grandmother's brother, Christian Livengood. I think he told me his father's name is Samuel, and other persons have told me the same, but it is not recorded in the memoranda. Neither did I record the name of the father of the banker who is married to James' sister but I think it was David, a son of John, a brother of my grandmother, Frances Livengood. As the record of each is very short and is explained already, I shall only give the address of James and his brother-in-law, the banker:

James Livengood, Elk Lick, Somerset Co., Pa.

Samuel D. Livengood, Meyersdale, Somerset Co., Pa.

On the 23rd of Sept. 1874, I also received from Joseph Fike, a son of Christina Livengood, the address of four of his children:

Samuel and Cyrus, living between his house and Meyersdale.

John and the wife of Wm. Beal, living in town.

All four are married. John has no children, Mrs. Beal has five, but I cannot say anything about the other two families except that one of the ladies, whom I saw, told me her maiden name was Peck, a niece of Sarah Peck.

As I can give no more than the above I will only put their address in the proper form, each having the same post office:

Samuel Fike, Cyrus Fike, John Fike (Mrs. Wm. Beal), Meyersdale, Somerset Co., Pa., Wm. Beal.

I might have said that John Fike gave me some of the above and that Mrs. Beal herself gave me the number of her children who are all small yet. John also directed me to the house of the widow Beeghley who will be mentioned next.

On the 24th I received this from my second cousin Sally Lichty, a daughter of John C. Lichty and Elizabeth Fike, children of Mary Miller and Christina Livengood, sisters of my grandparents:

Mr. and Mrs. Wm. Beeghley

Sally Lichty was married to Wm. Beeghley. He is dead. They have four children living. The oldest daughter is married to a Mr. Saylor. Missouria is at home and also Gabriel and his brother. Their address is Meyersdale, Pa.

On Sept. 25th, I received from John Keim and his wife, Barbara Livengood, (a daughter of Christian Livengood, a brother of my grandmother, Frances Livengood), a partial history of Barbara's father and mother, brothers and sisters. I could get but a few dates, but on the same day I received from her brother, Christian C. Livengood, the record kept by his father of the birth of each member of the family, by combining the date of birth with the subsequent history I have the following records:

Christian Livengood was born Sept. 14, 1761, married in Elk Lick, Pa. to Elizabeth Forney, and died in Elk Lick, Pa., June 27, 1837. His wife, Elizabeth Forney, daughter of Peter Forney, was born Mar. 29, 1769. Their children are:

Esther, born in Elk Lick, Sept. 4, 1809; married in Elk Lick to Wm. Glotfelty. They live in Garrett Co., Md. and have several children.

Sarah, born in Elk Lick, Aug. 7, 1811; married in Elk Lick to Jonas Keim. They lived in Elk Lick. He is dead. They had several children. Her address is: Elk Lick, Somerset Co., Pa.

Beatrice, Gage Co., Nebraska, Jan. 24, 1881. On the 25th day of last Nov., I had the pleasure of meeting the first one of father's second cousins I had ever seen. It was Henry Yother, a son of Henry Yother and Christina Nafzinger, a brother John Nafzinger, a brother of my great grandmother Barbara Nafzinger who was married to my great grandfather Peter Livengood. On that day he preached a Thanksgiving sermon at the Victory School House for he is a Mennonite preacher. He is one month younger than my father. He lived near Blue Springs, Neb., where he has lived about ten years and where several of his children now reside. His wife had been dead several years.

Holmesville, Gage Co., Neb., Wed., Aug. 17, 1887 — Cousin Samuel A. Kendall of Jefferson, Green Co., Iowa has been with us since last Thursday. He was married at Liscomb, Marshall Co., Iowa, Sept. 22, 1883, to Minnie Edith Wiley, a daughter of Jonas T. Wiley and Rilla Van Nest. He says the address of his brother John C. Kendall is Homestead, Allegheny Co., Pa., where he may be found except when there is vacation in his schools.

Holmesville, Neb., Feb. 21, 1888 — In a copy of the Meyersdale, Pa., Commercial is a mention of the death of uncle J. O. Kendall as follows: John O. Kendall of Greenville Twp., Somerset Co., Pa. died at his

home in Pocahontas Monday, Jan. 30, 1888, aged 70 years, 7 months, 25 days.

Holmesville, Gage Co., Neb., May 17, 1889 — We have a visit from one of our relatives, Theodore F. Livengood of Beeler, Nefs Co., Kansas. He is the son of Christopher Livengood a son of Abram Livengood of Scmerset Co., Pa. He was born in White Hall, Miama Co., Indiana, Sept. 1847; married in Holt Co., Mo. to Anna Salinda Moran. They had four children. Mrs. Livengood died six years ago.

Sickness and Death of Daniel Q. Miller

His home was with us two years and seven months preceding his death. His sickness came on so gradually it was difficult to determine when it began or when it became chonic. Two years ago this winter he had kidney trouble at times which continued through the summer of 1897. During the fall and winter of that year he grew worse. Nitre taken occasionally gave him relief. In June 1898 he spent about three weeks in Beatrice, consulting with several of the leading physicians and some who made periodical visits to the city. He was treated by two of them for temporary relief, but none of them expected a permanent cure.

His strength gradually failed until by Dec. 1, he was confined to the house, and from the middle of December most of the time to his bed. Whatever the origin of the disease may have been, it finally became catarrh of the bladder which gave him great pain at times and at last caused a constant burning. Still at times he read the daily news, or had it read to him. He also conversed on all subjects to the last. He often changed positions to relieve the pain, standing, walking, kneeling by the lounge with his stomach resting upon it were all favorite positions. The last refreshment was at 2 a.m. The last words were at 4:50 a.m. He had changed from kneeling to horizontal position; asked for his handkerchief and when laid on his hand said, "Put it in my hand." Then after wiping his mouth and nose said, "I will die this way." He died at 5 o'clock in the morning, Dec. 30, 1898, in the presence of all our family and T. M. Martin, Charles Martin, C. N. Foster and Joseph C. Dell. He was laid out by these four neighbors, the first of whom with George Ward had been selected by him for that purpose two weeks before.

Holmesville, Gage Co., Neb. Route 1, Box 53. Jan. 22, 1907 — The death of cousin D. W. Bowman was told to us by a letter from one of his boys at the time. A few days later he told of the death of his sister; each time asking me to let the relatives in the east know it, which was done.

The following notions of their deaths appeared in the Gospel Messenger of Dec. 1, 1906, under the title of "Fallen Asleep."

BOWMAN, ELD, DANIEL WEBSTER, died of typhoid fever and apollexy, in the Altamont Congregation, Labette Co., Kans., Oct. 30, 1906, aged 46 years, 7 months and 11 days. He was born in Somerset County, Penna. He united with the Brethren Church when a young man, and lived a very consistent life. He was united in marriage to Harriet Bare,

Sept. 29, 1881. Three boys and two girls were born to them. Owing to the serious illness of his wife and daughter, the funeral will be preached later.

BOWMAN, SISTER ALICE LUELLA died of typhoid fever, in the Altamont Congregation, Labette Co., Kansas, Nov. 7, 1906, aged 18 years, 2 months and 18 days. The mother being prostrated with fever, the funeral service will be held later.

Jacob Peter Miller was born Oct. 24, 1845 in Greenville Twp., Somerset Co., Pa. He received a common school education, was a farmer and during his lifetime purchased various farms which amounted to approximately 1000 acres. He farmed at home for his father until grown. He then married Catharine Bare who was born Nov. 1840, then purchased the William Bare farm from his father-in-law in 1878. He also started in the timber business. He greatly prospered in both farming and the timber business.

In community life he was a school director. His family belonged to the Church of the Brethren. He later joined the Lutheran Church of which he was deacon and elder.

He was a very robust man perhaps 6 feet 4 inches tall, and worked very hard. He had as high as 15 or 20 men working for him at one time,

most of them stayed overnight. That made lots of work for Mrs. Miller and her help, her daughter's helped with the work, also other help. In their younger days they raised flax, which she would weave into cloth and make their clothes from it. She also spun yarn from wool and knit the mittens and stockings for her family to wear.

He was fatally injured while operating a sawmill, by a piece of

timber striking him in the abdomen and died Aug. 11, 1889.

Sarah Miller, the oldest daughter of Jacob P. and Catherine (Bare) Miller was born Sept. 27, 1871. On March 28, 1901, she married Jacob Paul, born June 24, 1870. They lived on what was known as the George Warner farm ½-mile northwest of the Greenville Lutheran Church. She was a woman of medium stature, she had a temperamental disposition, but firm. When she said something she didn't repeat it.

When she was about 50 years old, she had a severe case of rheumatism which left her stooped; her hands were somewhat drawn crooked. After she recovered from her illness, she was very hardy. She was seldom sick, probably due to the medication she received during her illness. She was in fairly good health up until she died, she was never in bed due to sickness.

On the day of her death she was staying at her oldest daughter's home, Ida P. Swartzwelder. She ate her last meal at the table and went up stairs to her room to lie down. Knowing that her mother wasn't feeling well, Ida looked in on her some time later and found that she had passed away, June 21, 1957. Her husband preceded her in death on Jan. 21, 1943.

Harvey Miller, oldest son of Jacob P. and Catherine (Bare) Miller, was born on the Keefer farm in Greenville Twp., Somerset Co., Pa., Sept. 21, 1873. His schooling was acquired in the grade school on his father's farm. After he finished school, he worked on his father's farms and sawmills, which his father owned. He worked there till his father's death.

On April 6, 1890, he was confirmed and became a member of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Greenville Twp. by the Rev. O. F. Harshman. During his years he served almost continuously as an Elder or Deacon of the Church. He served faithfully for 57 years.

On Jan. 6, 1898 he married Belinda Baer, daughter of Elisha and Polly (Beal) Baer. She was born May 28, 1875. They were married at the bride's home by their pastor, Rev. E. S. Johnston. In the fall of 1899 they bought the Peter D. Miller farm at Pocahontas, Pa. They moved on this farm. To this union were born thirteen children. Two of whom died in infancy. They were all born in Greenville Twp., Somerset Co., Pa.

They were very devoted to their children and family. During school terms, when the weather was bad, he would haul the children to school, and in the evening he would meet them and take them home. During the days of horses, no weather was ever too bad, he would go with his family on the sled, through the fields and woods, shovel snow, if need be to get to church.

They were hard working people, she would spin the wool and knit the stockings and mittens for the children and her husband. She also made most of the clothes for them.

During his earlier married life, he ran an apple butter factory and cider mill that was on his farm. Every fall for three or four months when apples were plentiful, he would work from around 5:30 or 6 a.m. till midnight, five and six days a week. His brother Wilson and brother-in-law A. E. Baer were partners in operating the factory. His brother-in-law left the factory when his sons became large enough to help with the work. His wife would go help tie up the crocks of apple butter two or three nights a week, and on Saturdays.

When the new Evangelical Lutheran Church was built at Greenville in 1910, he helped with the work. He used his team for hauling whenever it was possible. He was one of the organizers of the Union Cemetery at Greenville and helped start the funds for perpetual care of the cemetery.

He served many terms as township road supervisor, also as township auditor. In 1946 he retired from farming. They sold their farm to their youngest son and his wife, Elbert and Hilda.

They lived together to celebrate their 59th wedding anniversary. He died June 8, 1957. Age 83 years, 8 months, 18 days. She died Jan. 31, 1961. Age 85 years, 8 months, 3 days.







II—Milton Peter Miller, youngest son of Jacob and Catherine (Bare) Miller, was born Sept. 8, 1884 at the family home in Greenville Twp., Somerset Co., Pa. This home is now occupied by W. W. Miller. He attended the Miller School to the sixth grade. He then worked on the farm until he was 16. After that he worked for the telephone company trimming trees and doing other lineman work.

He was always prepared to play jokes and tricks on his brothers, sisters, the local hermit and father's farm hands. He usually travelled with other young men who enjoyed this type of pastime. At 21 he was given the opportunity to go to college. He received an athletic scholarship for football and track. This included two years of prep school and four years of college at Gettysburg. He majored in chemistry. There he was nicknamed "Milky" because milk was the strongest beverage he would touch. He played right tackle on the football team, threw the hammer, javelin, discus and shotput in track. In 1911 he graduated with a Bachelor of Science degree.

He returned to Greenville and there purchased one of the first cars, a 1911 Ford roadster. That fall he taught in the Garrett High School. For some time he had courted a little Scotch school teacher from the Meyersdale Grade School. She was a graduate of the Indiana State Normal School. On May 8, 1912 they were married by the Rev. Young,

in the Lutheran parsonage. They settled in Meyersdale, where Milton then worked for the S. A. Kendell Lumber Co.

Due to the poor health of Milton and his wife they decided to move to South Langhorne, Bucks Co., Pa. Here he bought ten acres, built a large comfortable home, and worked in factories, and farmed. He established a lumber business and building business. At beginning of World War I due to the lack of lumber he had to close his business. He then worked in various building trades such as shipbuilding and homebuilding.

In 1925 he built an ice manufacturing plant which proved to be successful. It was during this time that his wife Agnes' health continued to fail, after a long illness she passed away on Jan. 13, 1928. Rev. Dallas Baer officiated at the funeral services and she was laid to rest in the Hulmeville Cemetery.

Milton continued in the business until fall of 1933. He then worked in various factories in Philadelphia, and finally moved there in 1935. Gradually he re-established a home there and in 1943 married Rose I. Brown. He was a great sports enthusiast, especially baseball. He was a devoted Philadelphia Athletics fan. As he drew near his retirement his main ambition was to go to Florida and make a home there. He never realized this lifelong ambition because with only four months to go until his retirement he was killed in an accident on the evening of April 8, 1949, at Midvale Steel Company. He was buried beside his wife in the Hulmeville Cemetery in Langhorne, Pa.
